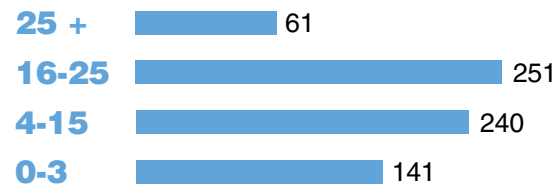

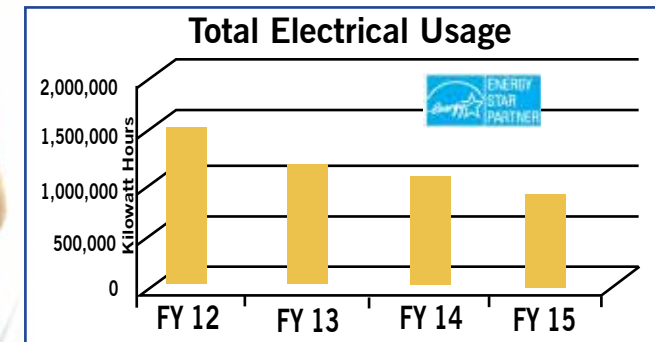

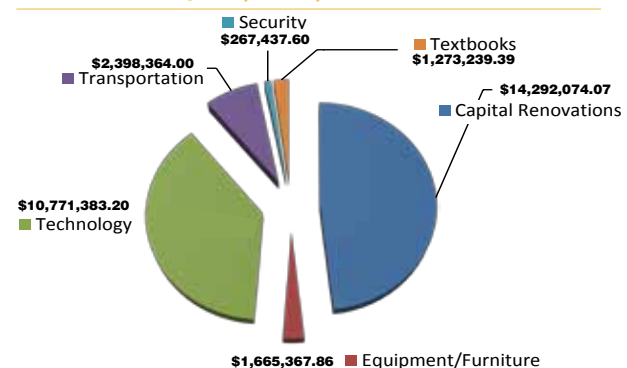
50% Students Receiving Free & Reduced Meals 2014 - 2015
